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## Dr. Eduardo Hernandez



Dr. Eduardo Hernandez joined the Edgewood ISD family as the Superintendent of Schools in June 2018, after the Board of Managers conducted a nationwide search for the district's next leader. During his more than 19 years of service in education, Dr. Hernandez has established a reputation of being a focused, strategic educational leader who has a positive record of improving student achievement and effective communication skills that strengthen employee and community support. Upon arrival in Edgewood ISD, Dr. Hernandez plans to develop and initiate an entry plan that focuses on listening and learning the dynamics that make this school district unique. The
