Pedagogical partnership is "a collaborative, reciprocal process" through which teacher and student partners "have the opportunity to contribute equally, although not necessarily in the same ways, to curricular or pedagogical conceptualization, decision making, implementation, investigation, or analysis" (Cook-Sather, Bovill, & Felten, 2014, pp. 6-7).

Dr. Cook-Sather has developed internationally recognized programs that position students as pedagogical consultants to college faculty members. She has published over 100 articles and book chapters and given as many keynote addresses, other invited presentations, and papers at refereed conferences on six continents.




