Lesson Assessment

Students will complete a graphic organizer comparing and contrasting historical figures' impact with Malala's impact.

Opening

Introduce Malala Yousafzai and her book "Malala's Magic Pencil."

Engage students with a discussion on the importance of education and social activism

Model

Introduce Malala Yousafzai and her book "Malala's Magic Pencil."

Engage students with a discussion on the importance of education and social activism

Guided Practice

Provide examples of historical figures who created change.

Scaffold questioning from simple to complex to deepen understanding of Malala's background and the challenges she faced.

Analyzing Malala's activism and its impact on educational rights.

Monitor student performance through group discussions and individual responses.

Independent Practice

Assign students to create a timeline of Malala's life and achievements.

Students will write a short reflection on how Malala's story inspires them to take action in their communities.

Closing

Have students share one thing they learned about Malala today.

Summarize key points discussed in the lessons (Understanding Malala's background and the challenges she faced; Analyzing Malala's activism and its impact on educational rights; Comparing historical figures' impact with Malala's impact).
